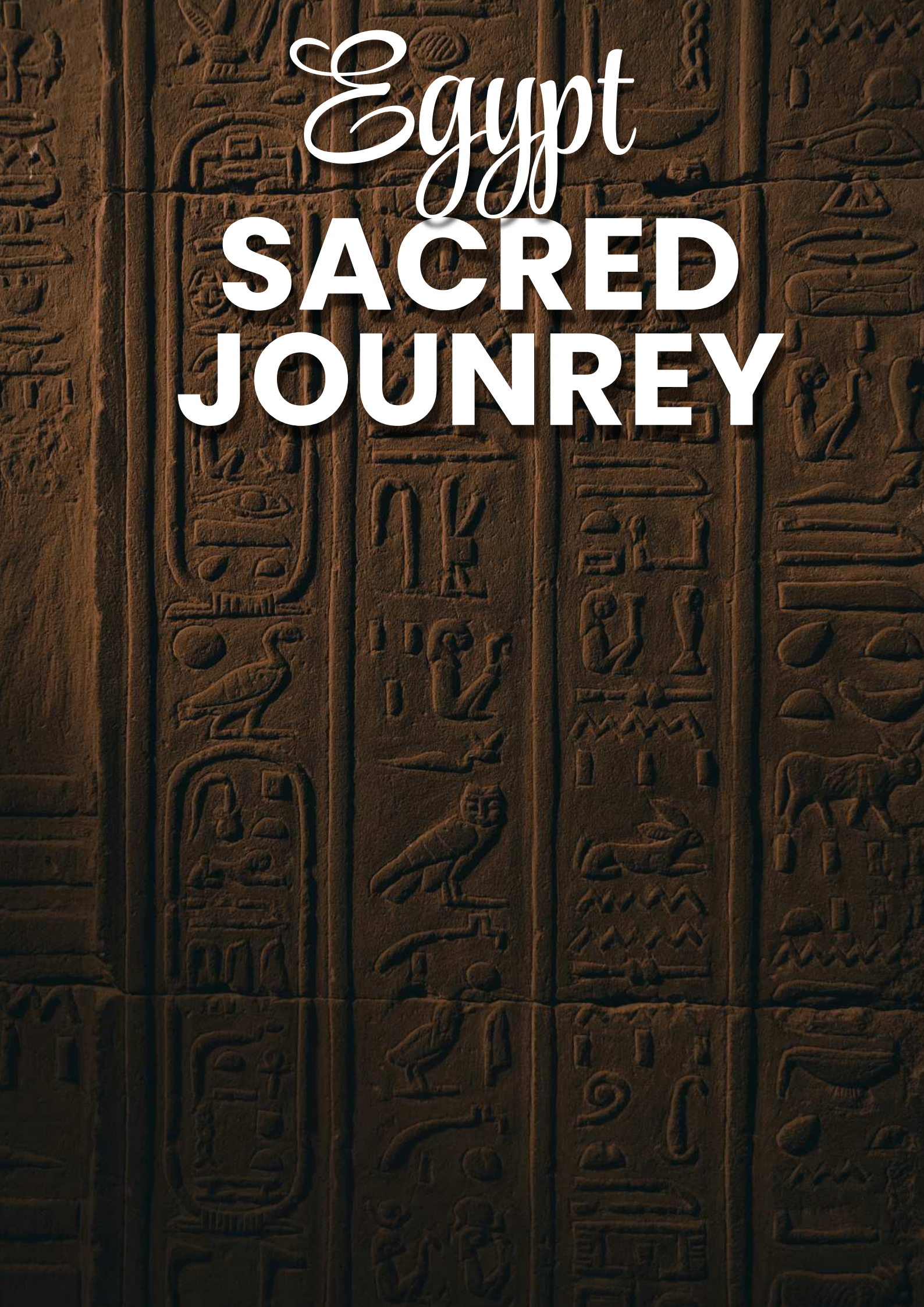

Bassam Bastawy was born and raised in a small village in Gharb Aswan, in the heart of what is known as the Nubian Kingdom of Egypt. He learned the rhythms of the Nile before he learned to read, following his father's footsteps aboard the sailboats that have carried travelers along the river for generations. Those early years on the water became his first education, not only in navigation, but in the art of connection, teaching him to welcome people of all cultures and walks of life with warmth, presence, and genuine hospitality.

Today, Captain Bassam is a respected community leader and cultural ambassador for the Nubian people. He leads groups to the sacred energetic sites along the Nile and through the powerful temples of ancient Egypt, known to its people as Kemet. His gift lies in his ability to open doorways, not only into the history and spiritual significance of these ancient places, but into the living culture of Nubia itself, its music, stories, traditions, and the quiet dignity of a heritage that stretches back millennia.

In 2019, Bassam transformed his family home into Nubian Kingdom Aragueed's House, a guesthouse that has become a destination in its own right. It is a place where the true essence of Nubian heritage can be felt: live music and singing, traditional cuisine, and an unmistakable energy of love and transparency. Guests return for the kayaking, sandboarding, camel riding, and felucca sailing along the Nile, but what they carry home is something deeper: the feeling of being welcomed as family.

His dedication has earned recognition as a top-ten property on Booking.com in 2021 and 2022 through the Traveller Review Awards, as well as Superhost status on Airbnb. But for those who know him, the awards only confirm what is already obvious. Bassam is a blessing to his family, his community, his heritage, and to every soul fortunate enough to share sacred space with him. We are deeply honored to have him as part of this journey.





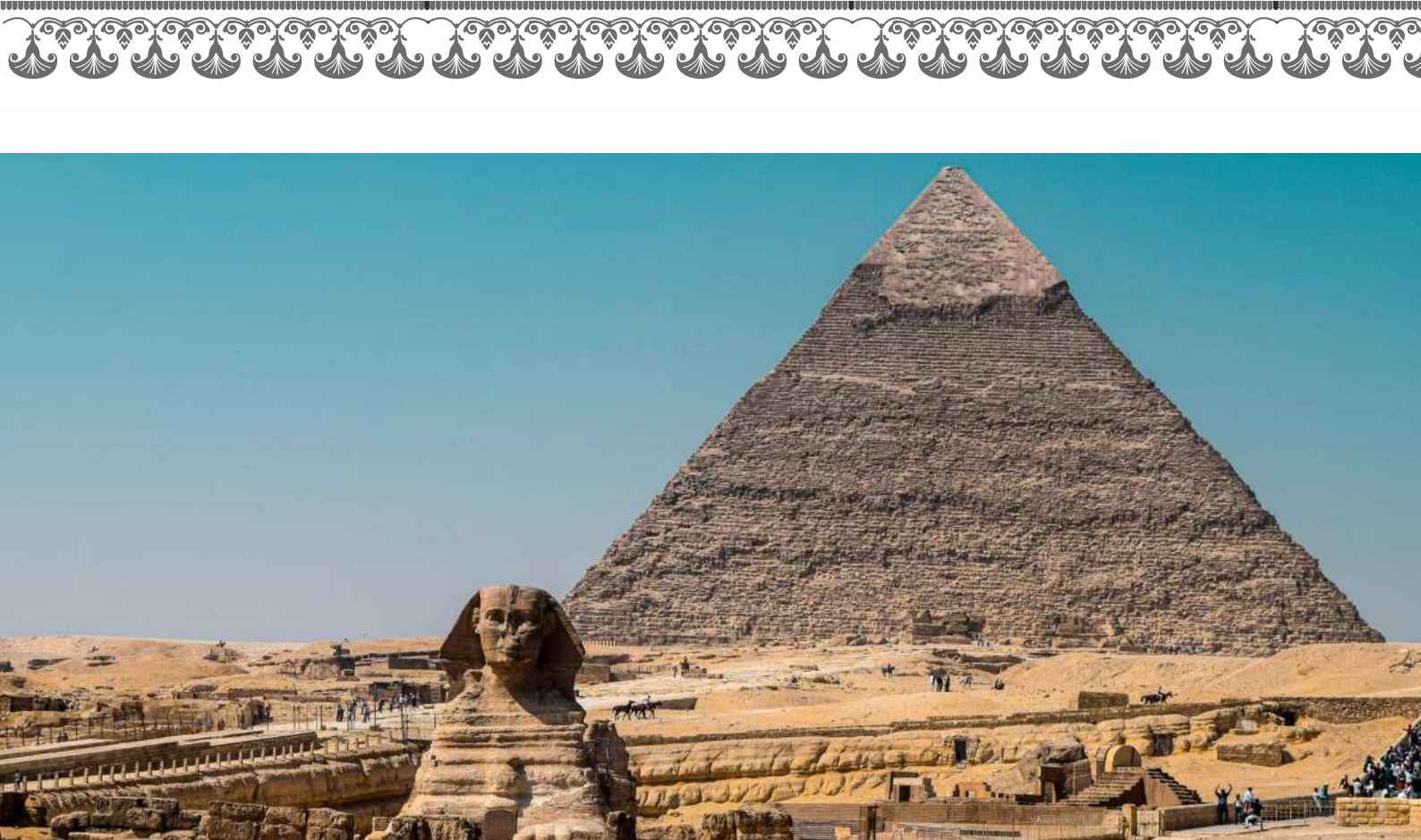
Day 1 **Welcome to Egypt**

Arrival in Cairo • Grounding • Opening Circle

You land in Cairo, the pulsing heart of a civilization that has called seekers home for millennia. The ancient Egyptians knew this land as Kemet, the Black Land, named for the rich, life-giving soil of the Nile. From the moment your feet touch the ground, something shifts. The air carries a frequency that has drawn pilgrims, mystics, and truth-seekers across centuries.

As the sun sets over the city, we gather for our Opening Circle. This is where the journey truly begins. We welcome one another as soul family, share what called us here, and set our sacred intentions for the days ahead. Together we honor the invisible thread that has drawn each of us back to this ancient land, acknowledging that this pilgrimage is both deeply personal and profoundly collective.





Day 2 **The Great Pyramids & Egyptian Museum**

King's Chamber • The Sphinx • Egyptian Museum

We stand before the Great Pyramid of Giza, the last surviving Wonder of the Ancient World and a monument that continues to defy modern understanding. More than a tomb, it is widely regarded as a site of initiation, a place where ancient priests and priestesses underwent profound spiritual transformation. We enter the King's Chamber, a granite room at the pyramid's core long associated with the expansion of consciousness and the activation of higher knowing.

From there, we walk in sacred meditation at the Great Sphinx, guardian of the Giza plateau for over 4,500 years. Its presence invites us to contemplate the mysteries of time, memory, and the soul's eternal journey. The day continues at the Egyptian Museum, where we move through halls filled with relics and treasures whose vibration still carries the living essence of Ancient Egypt. Every artifact tells a story of devotion, power, and the enduring human quest for the divine.



Day 3

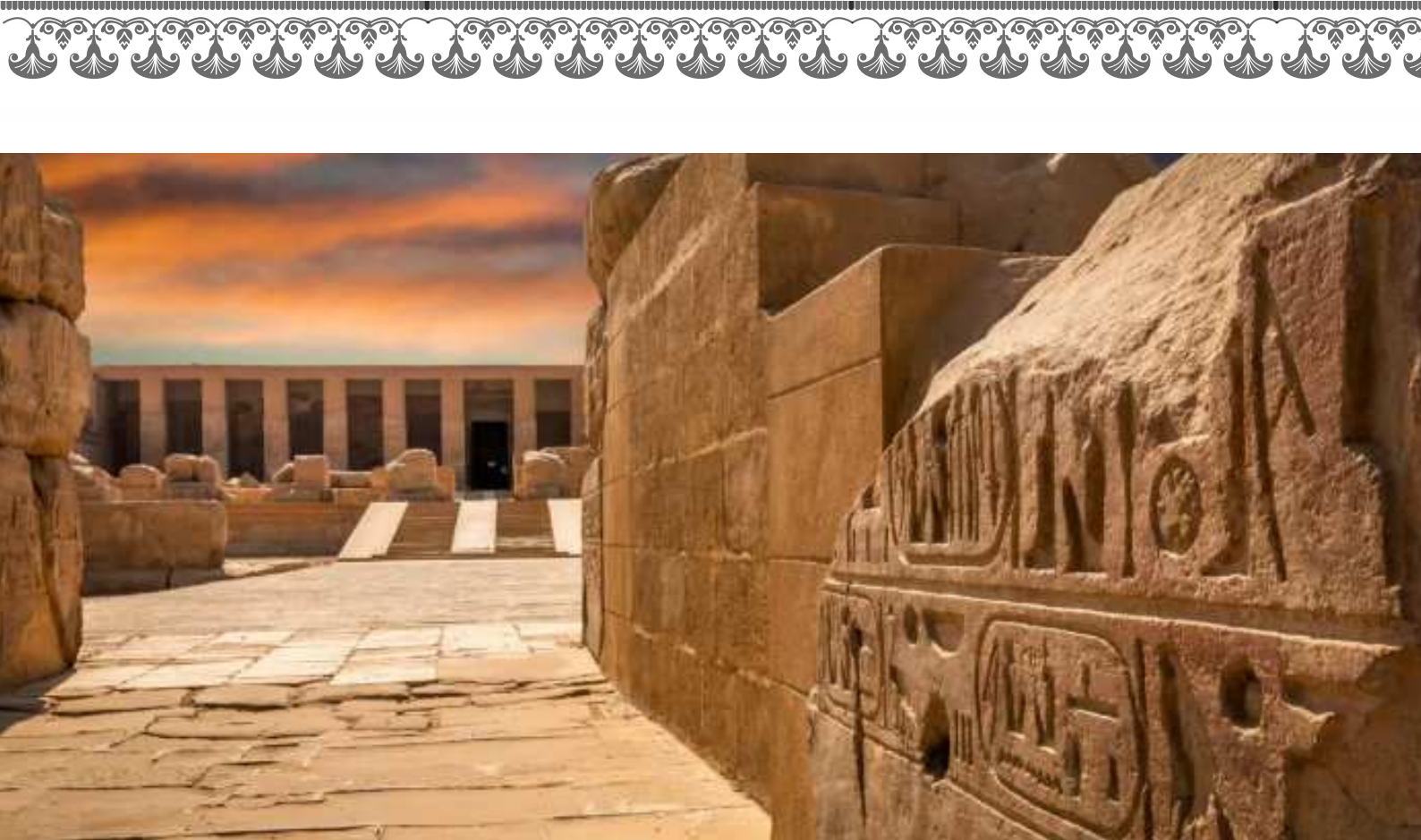
Luxor & Temple Initiation

Luxor • Avenue of the Sphinxes • Sacred Evening Procession

We take a domestic flight south to Luxor, the ancient city once known as Thebes, capital of the New Kingdom and the spiritual epicenter of pharaonic Egypt. This is where the great temples rose and where the relationship between heaven and earth was honored in stone.

At sunset, we visit the magnificent Luxor Temple, a site dedicated to the renewal of kingship and the divine spark within every human being. As the golden light falls across its towering columns and sacred reliefs, we walk the restored Avenue of the Sphinxes, a nearly two-mile ceremonial pathway that once hosted grand processions in honor of the God Amun. Walking this ancient route together, we offer our prayers and intentions, reconnecting with the highest purpose that lives within each of us.





Day 4 Dendera & Abydos

**Temple of Dendera • Goddess Hathor • Temple of Abydos •
Flower of Life Carving**

Today takes us deep into the heart of Egypt's temple tradition. We begin at the Temple of Dendera, one of the best-preserved sacred sites in all of Egypt, dedicated to the Goddess Hathor. She is the embodiment of love, joy, beauty, music, and divine feminine wisdom. Within her temple, the energy is palpable. We contemplate the ancient Flower of Life carving etched into the temple walls, a geometric symbol that speaks to the interconnected nature of all creation.

We continue to Abydos, one of Egypt's oldest and most revered pilgrimage destinations. Here stands the Temple of Osiris, where the ancient Egyptians came to honor the God of resurrection and the afterlife. The walls of this temple carry some of the most exquisite relief carvings in existence. In this sacred space, we explore the timeless themes of death, rebirth, transformation, and the sacred union of the soul with the divine.



Day 5

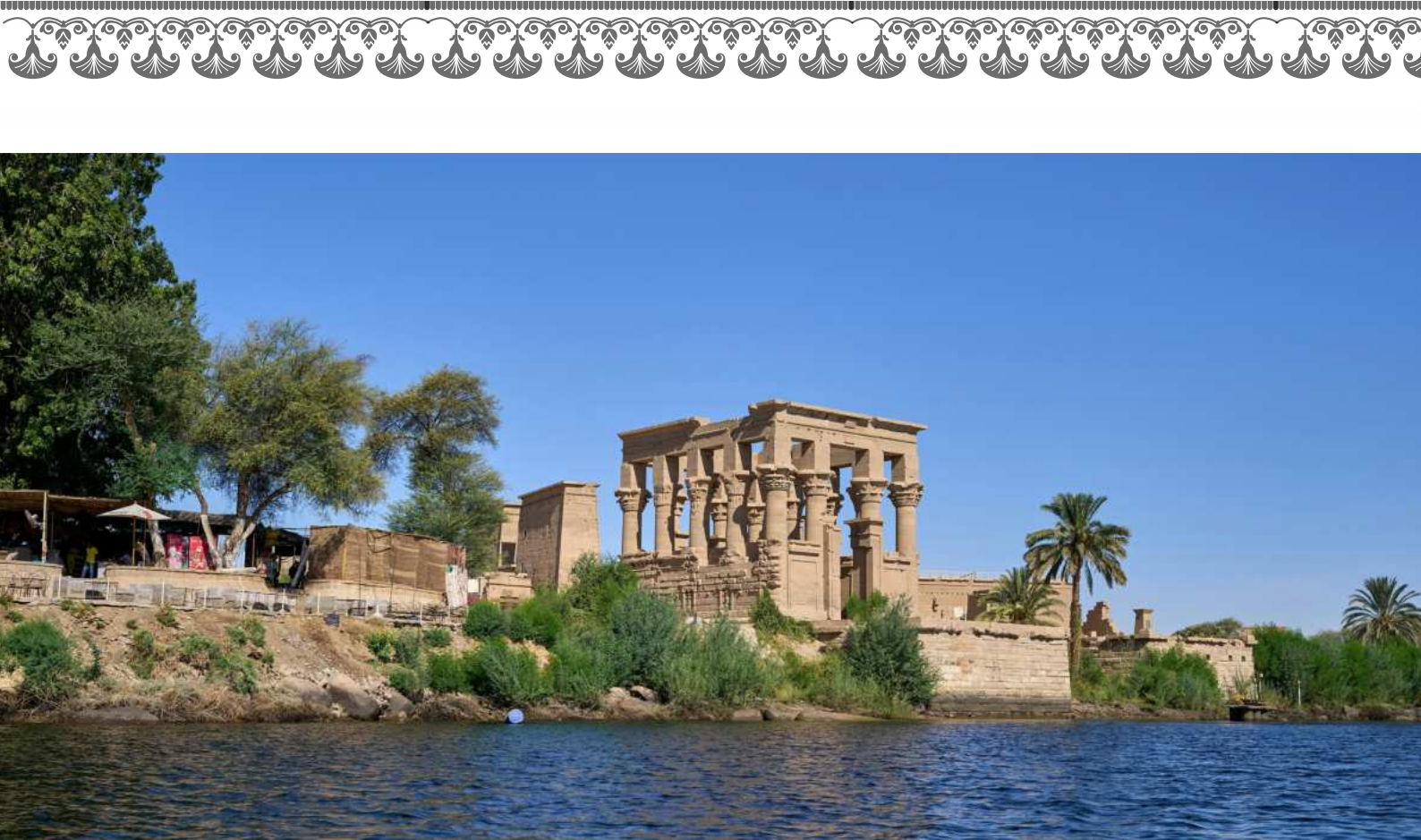
Valley of the Kings & Karnak

Valley of the Kings • Tomb Exploration • Karnak Temple

We cross to the west bank of the Nile and enter the Valley of the Kings, the hidden necropolis where Egypt's greatest pharaohs were laid to rest in elaborately decorated tombs carved deep into the desert rock. Walking through these chambers, surrounded by vivid paintings of the afterlife and the journey of the soul, we are invited into reflection on leadership, wisdom, legacy, and what it means to live with eternity in mind.

In the afternoon, we visit Karnak Temple, one of the largest religious complexes ever constructed on Earth. Its towering columns, vast hypostyle halls, and sacred lake create an atmosphere of overwhelming reverence. The geometry of this space was designed to mirror the cosmos itself. Here we sit in deep meditation, allowing the energy of thousands of years of prayer and ceremony to move through us. The day closes with a traditional Egyptian dinner and time for personal integration.





Day 6

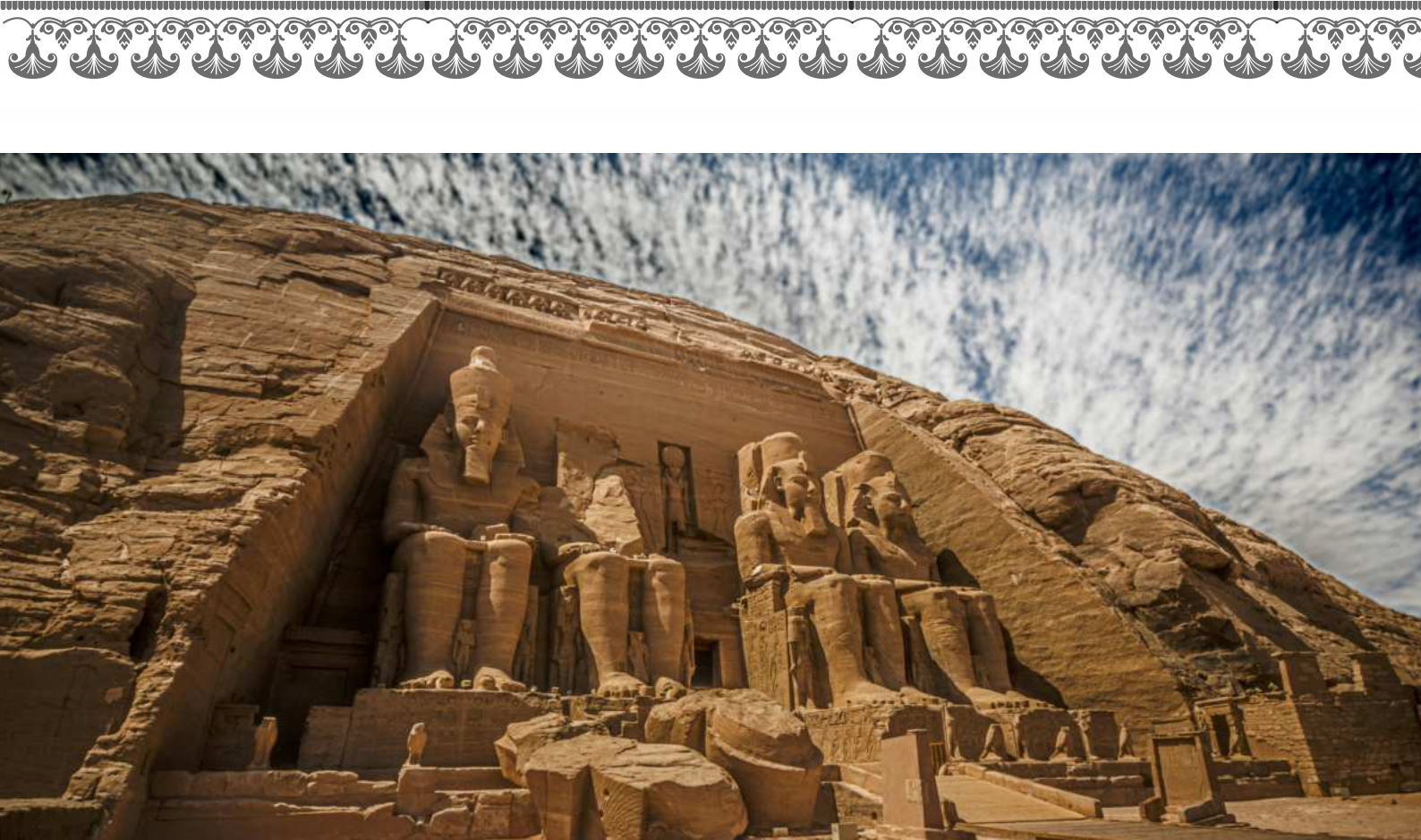
Aswan & Philae Temple

Temple of Isis at Philae • Private Ceremony

We travel south to Aswan, known as the Gateway to Nubia, where the Nile narrows between pink granite hills and the rhythm of the water invites a slower, more contemplative pace. Aswan has always been a place of transition, a threshold between worlds.

Here we visit the Temple of Isis at Philae, set on a small island surrounded by the flowing Nile. Isis, the Great Mother, the throne of wisdom, the keeper of sacred knowledge. Her temple is a place of deep nurturing energy, and within its walls we hold a private ceremony honoring the divine feminine, the cycles of life, and the healing power of devotion. This is one of the most intimate and powerful moments of the pilgrimage, a space to receive, to soften, and to remember what the heart already knows.





Day 7

Abu Simbel & Nubian Evening

**Abu Simbel • Temple of Ramses II • Temple of Nefertari •
Nubian Celebration**

Before sunrise, we journey to Abu Simbel, one of the most awe-inspiring monuments in all of Egypt. Carved directly into a mountainside by Pharaoh Ramses II, the Great Temple stands as a declaration of sacred power, its four colossal seated figures gazing eternally across the desert. Beside it stands the smaller but equally profound Temple of Queen Nefertari, dedicated to the Goddess Hathor and to the love between Ramses and his queen. Together, these temples embody the balance of masculine and feminine, strength and devotion, sovereignty and grace.

In the evening, we return to Aswan for an immersive Nubian experience. The Nubian people carry one of the oldest living cultural traditions on Earth, and we are welcomed into their warmth through traditional cuisine, live music, storytelling, and celebration. This is a night to let joy move through us, to dance, to laugh, and to honor the living culture that continues to thrive along the Nile.



Day 8

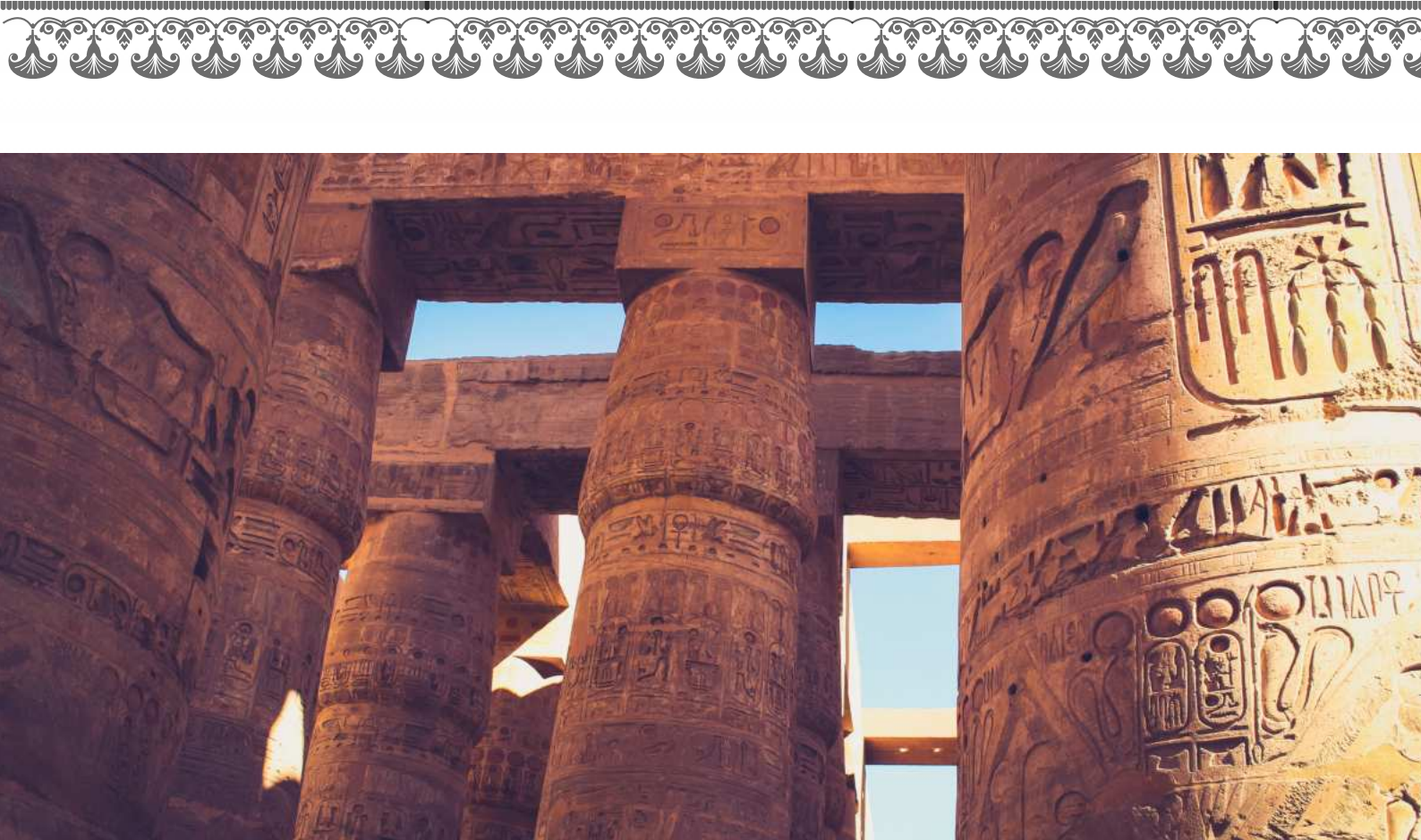
Nile Felucca & Closing Ceremony

Private Felucca Sail • Meditation & Journaling • Closing Ceremony

After days of powerful temple activations, today is devoted entirely to stillness and integration. We board a private felucca, a traditional Egyptian sailboat, and spend the day gently sailing the Nile as it has been sailed for thousands of years. The wind fills the sails, the water carries us, and time opens up. This is sacred space for meditation, journaling, quiet conversation, and simply being present with what has moved through you over the course of this pilgrimage.

As the day draws to a close, we gather for our Closing Ceremony. Together we honor everything we have experienced, every activation, every prayer, every tear, every breakthrough. We express gratitude for one another, for the land, and for the spiritual insights and transformations that will continue to unfold long after we leave Egypt.





Day 9

Closing Breakfast & Departure

Closing Breakfast • Group Reflection • Departure

Our final morning begins with a shared breakfast, one last gathering of soul family before the journey home. We take time to reflect on all that has transpired, to celebrate the memories created together, and to honor the wisdom and personal transformations that emerged throughout this pilgrimage. There may be tears. There will be laughter. And there will be a knowing that something within each of us has been permanently awakened.

As we depart, we carry with us the teachings of Ancient Egypt, the energy of the temples, and the sacred remembrance that was stirred within our hearts. This is not an ending. It is a homecoming to the truest version of ourselves.
